

About the Artist:



Antoinette M. Janecki paints a variety of subjects but is best known for her vivid landscapes and dramatic marine paintings. A resident Soho artist, she captures on paper and canvas the best of her two worlds - New York City where she lives and the waters off Greenport Long Island where she keeps her sailboat “H2O Color”.

Antoinette likes to work in a “series” and to paint on location “en plein air”.



Her artistic career began in 1983 with watercolors. Later a magazine article inspired her to try pastels and she loved them! Her very first pastel “Staten Island Ferry” was accepted into the 1991 Pastel Society of America’s annual show. The first of many pastels to be accepted into national exhibitions.

Antoinette’s work has been on exhibit in several NYC and regional galleries. In The New York Times, Sunday March 3, 2002 Art Reviews/Helen A. Harrison wrote: “Brilliant color is also a hallmark of Antoinette Janecki’s small pastel “Surf at Montauk” in which sea and sky are equally animated.”

Inspired by Impressionist Claude Monet, Antoinette traveled to his home in Giverny France to paint the same ponds and gardens. Although primarily self-taught, she also studied with Master Pastelist Richard Pionk at The Art Students League in NYC.

Antoinette exhibited at Fiedler Gallery, Greenport 2001 to 2019 when gallery closed. Currently her original pastels, note cards, and reproductions are available in her studio at 404 First Street Greenport - *by appointment only*. On-line web purchases will be available at a later date.
